Program Notes from the Meeting of June 17

Bob Holmes introduced Katie Doyle, executive director of Ozone House Youth and Family Services, on the topic "From Hippie to Hip Hop...Ozone House Turns 40." We were asked, if you had an 18-year-old son or daughter moving into an apartment, what would you like him or her to have? Ozone House still accommodates 18-year-olds who have been thrown out of their homes. Born in the basement of Canterbury House in the counter-culture of 1969, Ozone House places young people in apartments around town. Back in those early days, Katie recalled, the Ozone House board reached every decision, major or minor, by consensus. Today, safe housing is still a goal for

adolescents; Ozone House provides emergency housing to 130 young people annually while providing free, voluntary and confidential services. In addition, Ozone House runs a strong peer-to-peer outreach program for kids in the street and offers crisis intervention. "We try to track the outcomes of people we work with," said Katie, who operates with a \$1.7 million budget annually. *Notes prepared by Don Faber, Harpoon editor; Photos by Fred Beutler*
